## CARGO HANDLED AT STATE MARITIME/ STATE DIRECTORATE (Non-Major Ports) DURING APRIL, 2022

## Total Cargo traffic at India's State Maritime/ State Directorate

Maritime transport activity is driven by developments in world economy, viz, growth in world output and trade. Thus, volume of seaborne cargo traffic handled by ports is mainly shaped by the levels and changes in both the global and domestic activity. Cargo traffic at Non-Major Ports during **April 2022**, increased by **7.6% to 55.74 million tonnes** from 51.80 million tonnes handled during April 2021.

The overseas cargo handled at Non-Major Ports during April, 2022 increased by 4.0% to 45.92 million tonnes from 44.13 million tonnes during April, 2021. The coastal cargo handled at Non-Major Ports during April, 2022 also increased by 28.1% to 9.82 million tonnes from 7.67 million tonnes handled during April, 2021.

## Port-wise Cargo traffic handled during April, 2022

- During April, 2022, the Non-Major Ports of Maharashtra Maritime Board (MMB) posted highest growth in traffic of 60.9% followed by the Non-Major Ports of Tamil Nadu Maritime Board (TNMB) (42.8%), Ports Management Board, A&N (23.4%), Andhra Pradesh Maritime Board (APMB) (13.0%) and Gujarat Maritime Board (GMB) (1.1%). The State Maritime/ State Directorate which recorded negative growth in April, 2022 are Kerala Maritime Board (KMB) (67.2%), Captain of Ports, GOA (59.2%), Directorate of Ports, Puducherry (8.3%), Directorate of Ports, Karnataka (4.8%) and Directorate of Ports, Odisha (4.2%).
- Amongst the State Maritime/ State Directorate, Gujarat Maritime Board handled the maximum cargo traffic at 35.27 million tonnes with a share of (63.3%) in the total cargo handled at State Maritime/State Directorate followed by Directorate of Ports Andhra Pradesh (15.7%), Maharashtra Maritime Board (11.9%), Directorate of Ports, Odisha (5.8%), Tamil Nadu Maritime Board (1.6%), Directorate of Ports, Puducherry (1.3%), Ports Management Board, A&N (0.3%) and Directorate of Ports, Karnataka (0.1%).
- At a broad commodity level, **Fertilizer achieved highest growth of 558%** in April, 2022 followed by Project Cargo (126.3%), Foodgrains excluding Pulses (78.2%), Iron Ore (39.8%), Sugar (35.3%), Coking Coal (29.1%), Other Commodities (23.0%), Cement

- (9.8%), FRM Liquid (8.9%), POL Products (7.5%), Other Coal (7.5%) and POL Crude (1.0%). Pulses recorded highest negative growth of 100.0% in April, 2022 followed by Building Material (44.1%), Thermal Coal (33.5%), Edible Oil (31.0%), Iron and Steel (29.6%), Other Ores (10.4%), LPG or LNG (4.0%) and Container (3.1%).
- At a broad commodity level, Container handled the maximum cargo traffic of **9.37**Million tonnes with share of **16.8%** in April, 2022 followed by Other Coal (14.9%),
  POL Crude (13.5%), Other commodities (12.1%), POL Products (11.2%), Iron Ore
  (9.7%), Coking Coal (6.0%), Thermal Coal (5.1%), LPG & LNG (3.1%), Fertilizer and
  Cement (2.1%) each, Sugar (0.9%), Food grains excluding pulses (0.8%), Iron & Steel
  (0.7%), Edible oil (0.4%), Other Ores, Building Material and FRM Liquid (0.2%) each
  and Project Cargo (0.1%).







## Overseas and Coastal Cargo traffic handled during April, 2022

• Amongst the Non-Major Ports, Gujarat Maritime Board (GMB) handled the maximum Overseas Cargo of 31.23 million tonnes with a share of 68.0% followed by Andhra Pradesh Maritime Board (17.0%), Directorate of Ports, Odisha (6.1%), MMB (5.4%), TNMB (1.8%), Directorate of Ports, Puducherry (1.5%) and Directorate of Ports, Karnataka (0.2%) during April, 2022 (Graph 2).



Amongst the Non-Major Ports, MMB handled the maximum Coastal Cargo of 4.15 million tonnes with a share of 42.2% followed by GMB (41.1%), Directorate of Ports, Andhra Pradesh (9.6%), Directorate of Ports, Odisha (4.5%), A&N Islands (1.6%), TNMB (0.9%) and KMB (0.1%) during April, 2022 (Graph 3).
