CARGO HANDLED AT MAJOR PORTS DURING AND UP TO JUNE, 2019

Total Cargo traffic at India's Major Ports

Maritime transport activity is driven by developments in world economy, viz, growth in world output and trade. Thus, volume of seaborne cargo traffic handled by ports is mainly shaped by the levels and changes in both the global and domestic activity. Cargo traffic at India's 12 major ports during **April-June**, **2019-20**, **increased by 1.6% to 176.7 million tonnes** from 174.0 million tonnes cargo handled during April-June, 2018-19.

The overseas cargo handled at Major Ports increased by **0.3%** from 131.2 million tonnes during April-June, 2018-19 to 131.6 Million tonnes handled during April-June, 2019-20. However, the Coastal Cargo handled at Major port increased by **5.5%** from 42.8 million tonnes during April-June, 2018-19 to 45.1 million tonnes handled during April-June, 2019-20.


Port-wise Cargo traffic handled during June, 2019

- Cargo handled at India's major ports during June, 2019 is 57.56 million tonnes showing a decrease of 0.4% in the corresponding period of the previous year. The coastal cargo handled at Major Ports during June, 2019 increased by 2.1% from 14.0 million tonnes in June, 2018 to 14.3 million tonnes during June, 2019. The overseas cargo handled at Major Ports decreased by 1.1% to 43.27 million tonnes in June, 2019 as compared to 43.77 million tonnes during June, 2018.
- During June, 2019; Mormugao Port recorded the highest growth rate of 18.5% followed by Haldia Dock Complex (10.5%), Cochin Port (7.6%), Deendayal Port (6.2%), Paradip Port (5.6%), Vishakhapatnam (5.4%), Kolkata Dock System (3.4%) and Chidambaranar Port (0.7%). The major ports which recorded negative growth in June, 2019 are New Mangalore Port (30.8%), Chennai Port (15.8%), Kamarajar Port (11.0%), Mumbai Port (2.1%) and JNPT (0.7%).
- Amongst the 12 major ports, Deendayal Port handled the maximum cargo traffic of 10.06 million tonnes with a share of 17.5% in the total cargo handled at Major Ports followed by Paradip Port (16.9%), Vishakhapatnam Port (10.3%), JNPT (9.8%), Mumbai Port (7.9%), Haldia Dock Complex (7.0%), Chennai Port (6.8%), Chidambaranar Port (4.9%), Cochin Port (4.9%), New Mangalore Port (4.9%), Kamarajar Port (4.4%), Mormugao Port (2.1%) and Kolkata Dock System (2.6%).
- At a broad commodity level, Sugar achieved highest growth of 85.9% in June, 2019 followed by Project Cargo (76.7%), Iron ore (42.1%), FRM-Dry (30.3%), FRM-Liquid (29.1%), Coking Coal (23.5%), Other coal (8.1%), Fertilizer (6.6%), Cement (5.7%), LPG/LNG (3.8%), POL-Products (3.5%), Edible oil (0.4%) and Container (0.4%). Pulses recorded highest negative

- growth of 100% in June, 2019 followed by Food Grains (73.5%), Other Ores (36.3%), Iron & Steel (12.9%), POL-Crude (9.1%) and other commodities (1.9%).
- At a broad commodity level, Container handled the maximum cargo traffic of 12.27 Million tonnes in June, 2019 with a share of 21.3% followed by POL-Crude (21.0%), Thermal Coal (12.4%), POL products (9.2%), Other commodities (9.1%), Iron ore (7.7%), Coking coal (6.5%), Other coal (3.2%), Fertilizer (1.7%), Edible Oil (1.6%), LPG or LNG (1.6%), Iron & Steel (1.4%), FRM-Liquid (0.9%), FRM-Dry (0.8%), Cement (0.6%) and Other Ores (0.5%).

Cargo traffic handled during April-June, 2019-20

- During April-June, 2019-20, Cochin Port recorded highest growth in traffic at 10.0% followed by Haldia Dock Complex (7.2%), Deendayal Port (6.8%), Vishakhapatnam Port (6.7%), Paradip Port (5.9%), Kolkata Dock System (5.8%), JNPT (1.5%), Mumbai Port (0.6%) and Chidambaranar Port (0.4%). Major ports that recorded negative growth in traffic during April-June, 2019-20 were: Mormugao Port (16.5%) followed by New Mangalore (16.2%), Chennai Port (8.5%) and Kamarajar Port (4.4%) over April-June, 2018-19 (**Table A**).
- Amongst the Major Ports, Deendayal Port handled the maximum Cargo of 31.1 million tonnes with a share of 17.6% followed by Paradip Port (16.0%), JNPT (10.0%), Vishakhapatnam Port (9.8%), Mumbai Port (8.4%), Chennai Port (6.9%), Haldia Dock Complex (6.5%), New Mangalore Port (5.1%), Chidambaranar Port (5.0%), Kamarajar Port (4.8%), Cochin Port (4.8%), Kolkata Dock System (2.6%) and Mormugao Port (2.5%) during April-June, 2019-20 (Graph-I below).



- At a broad commodity level, Project Cargo recorded the highest growth in traffic at 63.7% followed by Iron ore (35.8%), Other Coal (31.7%), FRM-Liquid (28.2%), LPG/LNG (17.7%), Coking Coal (16.4%), POL-Product (12.3%), Container (5.0%) and Cement (0.4%). Pulses recorded the highest negative growth of 86.4% followed by FRM-Dry (27.4%), Food Grains excluding pulses (22.4%), Other commodities (20.9%), Iron & Steel (14.8%), Other ores (12.2%), Thermal Coal (6.1%), Fertilizer (5.8%), Edible Oil (4.7%) and POL-Crude (4.6%) over April-June, 2018-19 (**Table B**).
- Amongst all the commodities, Container handled the maximum cargo of 37.7 million tonnes with a share of 21.3% followed by POL-Crude (20.9%), Thermal coal (14.2%), POL Products (9.1%), Others commodities (8.3%), Iron ore (7.4%), Coking coal (5.9%), Other coal (3.8%), LPG/LNG (1.6%), Edible oil (1.6%), Fertilizer (1.3%), Iron & Steel (1.2%), FRM liquid (0.9%), Other ores (0.6%), Cement (0.6%) and FRM Dry (0.6%) during April-June, 2019-20.

Overseas and Coastal Cargo traffic handled during April-June, 2019-20

• Amongst the Major Ports, Deendayal Port handled the maximum Overseas Cargo of 26.03 million tonnes with a share of 19.8% followed by Paradip Port (14.3%), JNPT (12.6%), Vishakhapatnam Port (10.0%), Chennai Port (8.3%), Mumbai Port (6.2%), New Mangalore Port (5.2%), Chidambaranar Port (4.8%), Haldia Dock Complex (4.8%), Cochin Port (4.3%), Kamarajar Port (3.7%), Mormugao Port (3.1%) and Kolkata Dock System (2.9%) during April-June, 2019-20 (Graph II).



• Amongst the Major Ports, Paradip Port handled the maximum Coastal Cargo of 9.3 million tonnes with a share of 20.7% followed by Mumbai Port (15.0%), Haldia Dock Complex (11.6%), Deendayal Port (11.3%), Vishakhapatnam Port (9.1%), Kamarajar Port (8.1%), Cochin Port (6.4%), Chidambaranar Port (5.6%), New Mangalore Port (4.5%), Chennai Port (2.5%), JNPT (2.4%), Kolkata Dock System (1.8%) and Mormugao Port (1.0%) during April-June, 2019-20 (Graph III).
