CARGO TRAFFIC HANDLED AT MAJOR PORTS DURING and UPTO APRIL, 2019


Total Cargo traffic at India's Major Ports

Maritime transport activity is driven by developments in world economy, viz, growth in world output and trade. Thus, volume of seaborne cargo traffic handled by ports is mainly shaped by the levels and changes in both the global and domestic activity. Cargo traffic at India's 12 major ports during April, 2019 increased by 5.7% to 60.07 million tonnes from 56.81 million tonnes handled during April, 2018.

The overseas cargo handled at Major Ports increased by **5.2%** from 42.68 million tonnes in April, 2018 to 44.88 Million tonnes in April, 2019. However, the Coastal Cargo handled at Major port increased by **7.5%** from 14.13 million tonnes in April, 2018 to 15.19 million tonnes in April, 2019.

Cargo traffic handled during April, 2019

- During April, 2019 Deendayal Port recorded highest growth in traffic at 21.2% followed by Cochin Port (17.8%), Paradip Port (17.2%), Kolkata Dock System (14.4%), Vishakhapatnam Port (10.9%), V. O. Chidambaranar Port (1.7%), JNPT (1.7%), Kamarajar Port (1.6%) and Mumbai Port Trust (0.5%). Major ports that recorded negative growth in traffic during April, 2019 were: Mormugao Port (36.4%) followed by New Mangalore Port (8.3%), Chennai Port (6.7%) and Haldia Dock Complex (2.6%) over April, 2018 (Table A).
- Amongst the Major Ports, Deendayal Port handled the maximum Cargo of 11.3 million tonnes with a share of 18.8% followed by Paradip Port (15.9%), JNPT (10.0%), Vishakhapatnam Port (9.5%), Mumbai Port (8.3%), Chennai Port (6.6%), Haldia Dock Complex (5.7%), New Mangalore Port (5.4%), Chidambaranar Port (5.1%), Kamarajar Port (5.0%), Cochin Port (4.7%), Kolkata Dock System (2.6%) and Mormugao Port (2.5%) during April, 2019 (Graph I below).


- At a broad commodity level, other coal recorded the highest growth in traffic at 88.8% during April, 2019 followed by Project Cargo (64.6%), FRM Liquid (51.7%), LPG/LNG (35.5%), POL Products (21.1%), Iron ore (13.8%), Coking Coal (11.5%), Thermal Coal (11.3%), POL Crude (6.5%) and Container (5.7%). Food Grain excluding pulses recorded highest negative growth of 54.9% in traffic during April, 2019 followed by FRM Dry (40.7%), Other ores (38.2%), Other Commodites (32.5%), Fertilizer (23.3%), Edible oil (20.5%), Iron & Steel (13.6%), Pulses (12.3%) and Cement (5.3%) over April, 2018 (**Table B**).
- Amongst all the commodities, POL crude handled the maximum cargo of 12.59 million tonnes with a share of 21.0% followed by Container (20.9%), thermal coal (16.9%), POL Products (8.8%), others commodities (7.4%), iron ore (6.4%), Coking coal (5.3%), other coal (5.0%), LPG/LNG (1.8%), edible oil (1.5%), Iron & Steel (1.1%), FRM liquid (1.0%), fertilizer (0.8%), Cement (0.6%) and FRM Dry (0.5%) during April, 2019.

Overseas and Coastal Cargo traffic handled during April, 2019

Amongst the Major Ports, Deendayal Port handled the maximum Overseas Cargo of 9.3 million tonnes with a share of 20.8% followed by Paradip Port (14.2%), JNPT (12.6%), Vishakhapatnam Port (9.5%), Chennai Port (7.8%), Mumbai Port (6.3%), New Mangalore Port (6.2%), Chidambaranar Port (4.9%), Cochin Port (4.6%), Haldia Dock Complex (3.8%), Kamarajar Port (3.4%), Mormugao Port (3.0%) and Kolkata Dock System (2.8%) during April, 2019 (Graph II).



Amongst the Major Ports, Paradip Port handled the maximum Coastal Cargo of 3.2 million tonnes with a share of 20.9% followed by Mumbai Port (14.3%), Deendayal Port (13.0%), Haldia Dock Complex (11.2%), Kamarajar Port (9.4%), Vishakhapatnam Port (9.4%), Chidambaranar Port (5.8%), Cochin Port (5.0%), New Mangalore Port (3.1%), Chennai Port (2.8%), JNPT (2.2%), Kolkata Dock System (1.9%) and Mormugao Port (0.8%) during April, 2019 (Graph III).
