CARGO HANDLED AT STATE MARITIME/ STATE DIRECTORATE (Non-Major Ports) DURING AND UP TO SEPTEMBER, 2023

Total Cargo traffic at India's State Maritime/ State Directorate

Maritime transport activity is driven by developments in world economy, viz, growth in world output and trade. Thus, volume of seaborne cargo traffic handled by ports is mainly shaped by the levels and changes in both the global and domestic activity. Cargo traffic at Non-Major Ports during **April-September**, 2023-24, increased by 6.3% to 345.30 million tonnes from 324.68 million tonnes handled during April-September, 2022-23.

The overseas cargo traffic handled at Non-Major Ports during April-September, 2023-24 increased by 4.2% to 280.48 million tonnes from 269.08 million tonnes during April-September, 2022-23. The coastal cargo traffic handled at Non-Major Ports during April-September, 2023-24 increased by 16.6% to 64.82 million tonnes from 55.61 million tonnes handled during April-September, 2022-23.


Port-wise Cargo traffic handled during September, 2023

- Cargo handled at Non-Major Ports during September, 2023 is 51.85 million tonnes showing an increase in growth of 3.9% as compared to 49.92 million tonnes of cargo handled in the corresponding period of the previous year. The coastal cargo traffic handled at Non-Major Ports during September, 2023 decreased by 3.0% to 9.40 million tonnes from 9.69 million tonnes during September, 2022. The overseas cargo handled at Non-Major Ports during September, 2023 increased by 5.5% to 42.45 million tonnes from 40.23 million tonnes during September, 2022.
- During September, 2023, the Non-Major Ports of Directorate of Ports, Puducherry recorded highest growth in traffic of 82.9% as compared to the corresponding period of the previous year, followed by the Non-Major Ports of Directorate of Ports, Karnataka (71.6%), Directorate of Ports, Odisha (21.0%), Ports Management Board, A&N (16.7%), Gujarat Maritime Board (GMB) (12.3%), Maharashtra Maritime Board (MMB) (12.3%). The State Maritime/ State Directorate which recorded negative growth in September, 2023 are Andhra Pradesh Maritime Board (48.9%) followed by Kerala Maritime Board (KMB) (43.3%) and Tamil Nadu Maritime Board (TNMB) (18.1%).
- During September, 2023, amongst the State Maritime/ State Directorate, Gujarat Maritime Board handled the maximum cargo traffic at 36.35 million tonnes with a share of (70.1%) in the total cargo handled at State Maritime/State Directorate followed by Maharashtra Maritime Board (11.3%), Andhra Pradesh Maritime Board (7.6%), Directorate of Ports, Odisha (7.0%), Directorate of Ports, Puducherry (2.3%), Tamil Nadu Maritime Board (1.4%), Ports Management Board, A&N Islands (0.3%) and Directorate of Ports, Karnataka (0.1%).

- At a broad commodity level, **Project Cargo record highest growth of 103.7%** in September, 2023 as compared to the corresponding period of the previous year followed by Thermal Coal (82.7%), LPG or LNG (64.1%), Iron Ore (63.6%), Containers (13.3%), POL Crude (8.6%) and Other Commodities (0.6%). **Foodgrains excluding Pulses** recorded highest negative growth of 98.2% in September, 2023 followed by Other Ores (80.4%), Edible Oil (63.4%), Fertilizer (52.6%), Pulses (48.7%), Other Coal (31.2%), Sugar (25.9%), FRM Liquid (23.3%), Coking Coal (13.9%), Cement (13.7%), Building Material (4.2%), POL Products (3.6%), and Iron & Steel (0.4%).
- At a broad commodity level, **Containers** shows the maximum cargo traffic of **10.37 Million tonnes with share of 20.0%** in September 2023 followed by POL Crude (15.1%), Iron ore Pellets/ Fine (11.2%), POL Products (11.1%), Other Coal (10.8%), Other Commodities (9.3%), Thermal Coal (8.2%), Coking Coal (5.5%), LPG or LNG (4.3%), Cement (1.4%), Fertilizer (1.2%), Iron & Steel(0.6%), Edible Oil (0.3%), Sugar FRM Liquid and FRM Dry (0.2%) each, Other Ores, Pulses, Project Cargo and Building Material (0.1%) each.

Cargo traffic handled during April-September, 2023-24

• During the April-September, 2023-24, **Captain of Ports, Goa** recorded highest growth in traffic at 233.9% although there is negligible share in total Cargo handled followed by Directorate of Ports, Karnataka (19.8%), Directorate of Ports, Odisha (19.6%), Maharashtra Maritime Board (19.0%), Directorate of Ports, Pudducherry (16.0%), Gujarat Maritme Board (4.6%), Tamil Nadu Maritime Board (1.0%) and Andhra Pradesh Maritime Board (0.1%). State Maritime/ State Directorate that recorded negative growth in traffic during April-September, 2023-24 was Kerala Maritime Board (16.3%) and Ports Management Board, A&N Islands (1.2%) over April-September, 2022-23 (**Table-1**).

• Amongst the State Maritime/ State Directorate, Gujarat Maritime Board handled the maximum Cargo of 218.10 million tonnes with a share of 63.2% followed by Andhra Pradesh Maritime Board (15.4%), Maharashtra Maritime Board (10.7%), Directorate of Ports, Odisha (7.3%),

Directorate of Ports, Puducherry (1.6%), Tamil Nadu Maritime Board (1.4%) and Others (0.4%) which includes cargo handled by Non-Major Ports of A&N Island, GOA, Kerala and Karnataka during April-September, 2023-24 (Graph 1 above).

- During the April-September, 2023-24, **Building Material** record highest growth of 63.1% followed by Iron Ore (58.4%), Other Ores (19.3%), Edible Oil (16.1%), LPG or LNG (13.3%), Pulses (11.9%), Containers (11.3%), Thermal Coal (10.4%), POL Products (8.6%), POL Crude (3.5%) and Other Commodities (2.9%). **Foodgrains excluding Pulses** recorded highest negative growth of 56.2% in traffic during April-September, 2023-24 followed by Sugar (47.8%), Project Cargo (44.8%), Iron and Steel (18.9%), Cement (17.7%), Fertilizer (14.5%), Other Coal (7.5%), FRM Liquid (1.4%) and Coking Coal (0.3%) over April-September, 2022-23 (**Table 2**).
- Amongst all commodities, **Containers** is the highest commodity handled at ports of 63.28 million tonnes with a share of 18.3% followed by Other Coal (15.7%), POL Crude (13.6%), POL Products (10.9%), Iron Ore (10.2%), Other Commodities (9.9%), Thermal Coal (6.3%), Coking Coal (5.9%), LPG & LNG (3.3%), Fertilizer (1.6%), Cement (1.3%), Iron & Steel (0.6%), Edible Oil (0.5%), Foodgrains excluding Pulses (0.4%), FRM Dry and Other Ores(0.3%) each, Sugar, FRM Liquid and Building Material (0.2%) each and Pulses (0.1%) during April-September, 2023-24.



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
Overseas and Coastal Cargo traffic handled during April-September, 2023-24

• Amongst the Non-Major Ports, Gujarat Maritime Board handled the maximum Overseas Cargo of 194.94 million tonnes with a share of 69.5% followed by Andhra Pradesh Maritime Board (13.8%), Directorate of Ports, Odisha (8.1%), Maharashtra Maritime Board (4.7%), Directorate of Ports, Puducherry (2.0%), Tamil Nadu Maritime Board (1.7%) and Others (0.2%) which includes cargo handled by Non-Major Ports of A&N Island, GOA, Kerala and Karnataka during April-September, 2023-24 (Graph 2).

• Amongst the Non-Major Ports, Maharashtra Maritime Board handled the maximum Coastal Cargo of 23.84 million tonnes with a share of 36.8% followed by Gujarat Maritime Board (35.7%), Andhra Pradesh Maritime Board (22.3%), Directorate of Ports, Odisha (3.5%), A&N Islands (1.3%), Tamil Nadu Maritime Board (0.2%) and Others (0.2%). Others include cargo handled by Non-Major Ports of Puducherry, GOA, Kerala and Karnataka during April-September, 2023-24 (Graph 3).
