CARGO HANDLED AT MAJOR PORTS DURING AND UP TO FEBRUARY, 2020

Total Cargo traffic at India's Major Ports

Maritime transport activity is driven by developments in world economy, viz, growth in world output and trade. Thus, volume of seaborne cargo traffic handled by ports is mainly shaped by the levels and changes in both the global and domestic activity. Cargo traffic at India's 12 major ports during **April-February**, 2019-20, increased by 1.5% to 642.88 million tonnes from 633.12 million tonnes cargo handled during April-February, 2018-19.

The overseas cargo handled at Major Ports increased by **3.0%** from 476.01 million tonnes during April-February, 2018-19 to 490.13 Million tonnes handled during April-February, 2019-20. However, the Coastal Cargo handled at Major port decreased by **2.8%** from 157.12 million tonnes during April-February, 2018-19 to 152.75 million tonnes handled during April-February, 2019-20.

Port-wise Cargo traffic handled during February, 2020


- Cargo handled at India's major ports during February, 2020 is 57.23 million tonnes showing an increase of 4.6% as compared to the corresponding period of the previous year. The coastal cargo handled at Major Ports during February, 2020 decreased by 1.8% from 15.05 million tonnes in February, 2019 to 14.77 million tonnes during February, 2020. However, the overseas cargo handled at Major Ports increased by 7.0% to 42.46 million tonnes in February, 2020 as compared to 39.67 million tonnes during February, 2019.
- During February, 2020; Visakhapatnam Port recorded the highest growth of traffic handled i.e. 34.3% followed by Mormugao Port (24.6%), Haldia Dock Complex (15.1%), New Mangalore Port (14.0%), V.O. Chidambaranar Port (10.4%), Mumbai Port (6.2%), Paradip Port (5.6%) and JNPT (3.1%) The major ports which recorded negative growth in February, 2020 are Chennai Port (16.8%), Kolkata Dock (14.1%), Kamarajar Port (12.2%), Cochin Port (3.2%) and Deendayal Port (1.4%).
- Amongst the 12 major ports, Deendayal Port handled the maximum cargo traffic of 9.4 million tonnes with a share of 16.4% in the total cargo handled at Major Ports followed by Paradip Port (16.1%), Vishakhapatnam Port (10.5%), JNPT (10.0%), Mumbai Port (8.8%), Haldia Dock Complex (7.4%), New Mangalore Port (5.9%), Chennai Port (5.9%), Chidambaranar Port (5.1%), Cochin Port (5.0%), Kamarajar Port (4.3%), Mormugao Port and Kolkata Dock System (2.3%) each.
- At a broad commodity level, Sugar achieved highest growth of 155.1% in February, 2020 followed by Project Cargo (83.4%), Iron ore (66.1%), FRM-Liquid (39.7%),

LPG/LNG (31.7%), FRM-Dry (28.9), Coking Coal (26.9%), Other Coal (12.8%), POL-Crude (5.1%), Fertilizer (2.2%), Container (1.3%) and POL Products (0.3%). Food Grain excluding pulses recorded highest negative growth of 49.6% in February, 2020 followed by Iron and Steel (29.1%), Other ore (20.3%), Edible Oil (19.8%), Cement (18.4%), Other Commodities (12.3%) and Thermal Coal (9.5%).

• At a broad commodity level, POL-Product handled the maximum cargo traffic of 12.7 Million tonnes in February, 2020 with a share of 22.1% followed by Container (20.6%), Thermal Coal (12.4%), POL Products (9.0%), Iron ore (8.8%), Other commodities (7.7%), Coking coal (5.7%), Other coal (4.0%), LPG/LNG (2.2%), Edible Oil (1.4%), Iron & Steel (1.2%), FRM-Liquid (1.0%), Fertilizer & FRM Dry (0.9%) each, Other Ores (0.6%), Cement & Sugar (0.6%) each, Project Cargo (0.2%) and Food grains excluding Pulses (0.1%).

Cargo traffic handled during April-February, 2019-20

- During April-February, 2019-20, Vishakhapatnam Port recorded highest growth in traffic handled at 12.7% followed by Deendayal Port (7.0%), Cochin Port (6.1%), V.O.C Port (5.1%), Haldia Dock (4.5%), Paradip Port (4.0%) and Mumbai Port (2.5%). Major ports that recorded negative growth in traffic during April-February, 2019-20 were: Chennai Port (11.0%) followed by New Mangalore Port (10.9%), Mormugao Port (9.8%), Kamarajar Port (7.8%), JNPT (2.8%) and Kolkata Dock (1.5%) over April-February, 2018-19 (Table A).
- Amongst the Major Ports, Deendayal Port handled the maximum Cargo of 111.36 million tonnes with a share of 17.3% followed by Paradip Port (16.0%), Vishakhapatnam Port (10.4%), JNPT (9.7%), Mumbai Port (8.8%), Chennai Port (6.7%), Haldia Dock Complex (6.6%), New Mangalore Port (5.3%), Chidambaranar Port (5.1%), Cochin Port (4.8%), Kamarajar Port (4.5%), Kolkata Dock System (2.5%) and Mormugao Port (2.3%) during April-February, 2019-20 (Graph- I below).

- At a broad commodity level, **Project Cargo** recorded the **highest growth in traffic at 120.6%** followed by Sugar (50.8%), Iron ore (37.9%), Food Grain excluding pulses (24.3%), LPG/LNG (21.4%), Fertilizer (19.7%), FRM-Liquid (10.8%), POL-Product (8.8%), other coal (5.7%), Coking Coal (5.6%), Container (2.1%). Pulses recorded the highest negative growth of 59.5% followed by Thermal Coal (16.9%), Other Ores (6.9%), POL-Crude (2.9%), Edible Oil (2.0%), Other Commodities (1.4%), Cement (1.3%), Iron & Steel (0.5%) and FRM Dry (0.2%) over April-February, 2018-19 (**Table B**).
- Amongst all the commodities, POL-Crude handled the maximum cargo of 138.29 million tonnes with a share of 21.5% followed by Container (21.0%), Thermal coal (11.4%), POL Products (9.7%), Others commodities (9.1%), Iron ore (7.8%), Coking coal (5.7%), Other coal (3.8%), LPG/LNG (1.9%), Edible oil (1.7%), Fertilizer (1.4%), Iron & Steel (1.3%), FRM Dry (1.0%), FRM liquid (0.9%), Other ores (0.6%), Cement (0.6%), Sugar (0.4%) and Project Cargo and Foodgrains excluding Pulses (0.1%) during April-February, 2019-20.



Overseas and Coastal Cargo traffic handled during April-February, 2019-20

Amongst the Major Ports, Deendayal Port handled the maximum Overseas Cargo of 95.92 million tonnes with a share of 19.6% followed by Paradip Port (14.3%), JNPT (12.0%), Vishakhapatnam Port (10.5%), Chennai Port (7.9%), Mumbai Port (6.5%), Haldia Dock (5.9%), New Mangalore Port (5.2%), Chidambaranar Port (5.0%), Cochin Port (4.3%), Kamarajar Port (3.4%), Kolkata Dock (2.7%) and Mormugao Port (2.7%) during April-February, 2019-20 (Graph II).



• Amongst the Major Ports, Paradip Port handled the maximum Coastal Cargo of 32.36 million tonnes with a share of 21.2% followed by Mumbai Port (16.0%), Vishakhapatnam Port (10.1%), Deendayal Port (10.1%), Haldia Dock (9.0%), Kamarajar Port (8.1%), Cochin Port (6.5%), New Mangalore Port (5.6%), Chidambaranar Port (5.3%), Chennai Port (2.9%), JNPT (2.5%), Kolkata Dock (1.7%) and Mormugao Port (0.9%) during April-February, 2019-20 (Graph III).
