CARGO HANDLED AT STATE MARITIME/ STATE DIRECTORATE (Non-Major Ports) DURING AND UP TO MARCH, 2020

Total Cargo traffic at India's State Maritime/ State Directorate

Maritime transport activity is driven by developments in world economy, viz, growth in world output and trade. Thus, volume of seaborne cargo traffic handled by ports is mainly shaped by the levels and changes in both the global and domestic activity. Cargo traffic at Non-Major Ports during **April-March**, 2019-20, increased by 4.2% to 602.51 million tonnes from 578.50 million tonnes handled during April-March, 2018-19.

The overseas cargo handled at Non-Major Ports during April-March, 2019-20 increased by 5.7% to 511.56 million tonnes from 483.99 million tonnes during April-March, 2018-19. However, the coastal cargo handled at Non-Major Ports during April-March, 2019-20 decreased by 3.8% to 90.95 million tonnes from 94.51 million tonnes handled during April-March, 2018-19.


Port-wise Cargo traffic handled during March, 2020

- Cargo handled at Non-Major Ports during March, 2020 is 51.00 million tonnes showing a decrease of 7.6% in the corresponding period of the previous year. However, the coastal cargo handled at Non-Major Ports during March, 2020 decreased by 15.2% to 7.60 million tonnes from 8.97 million tonnes during March, 2019. The overseas cargo handled at Non-Major Ports during March, 2020 decreased by 6.1% to 43.40 million tonnes from 46.21 million tonnes during March, 2019.
- During March, 2020, the Non-Major Ports of Directorate of Ports, Odisha (44.0%) recorded highest growth in traffic, followed by the Non-Major Ports of Tamil Nadu Maritime Board (21.6%). The State Maritime/ State Directorate which recorded negative growth in March, 2020 are Directorate of Ports, Karnataka (76.2%), Kerala Maritime Board (60.0%), Directorate of Ports, Pudducherry (29.9%), Maharashtra Maritime Board (19.7%), Gujarat Maritime Board (GMB) (9.6%), Ports Management Board, A&N (4.7%) and Directorate of Ports, Andhra Pradesh (2.1%).
- Amongst the State Maritime/ State Directorate, Gujarat Maritime Board handled the maximum cargo traffic at 34.68 million tonnes with a share of (68.0%) in the total cargo handled at State Maritime/State Directorate followed by Directorate of Ports, Andhra Pradesh (16.5%), Maharashtra Maritime Board (6.8%), Directorate of Ports, Odisha (6.5%), Directorate of Ports, Puducherry (1.4%), Ports Management Board, A&N Islands and Tamil Nadu Maritime Board (0.3%) each and Directorate of Ports, Karnataka (0.1%).

- At a broad commodity level, **LPG or LNG achieved highest growth of 23.1%** in March, 2020 followed by Other Coal (19.1%), Other Commodities (11.2%), Building Material (1.9%), Container (1.6%) and Iron Ore Pellets/ Fine (0.1%). Project Cargo recorded highest negative growth of 81.0% in March, 2020 followed by Other Ores (65.1%), Cement (53.2%), Fertilizer (48.0%), Thermal Coal (45.2%), Sugar (39.7%), Food-grains excluding Pulses (28.9%), Edible Oil (23.3%), FRM Liquid (15.6%), POL Crude (12.5%), Iron and Steel (9.5%), Coking Coal (8.1%) and POL Products (1.9%).
- At a broad commodity level, POL Crude handled the maximum cargo traffic of **8.25 Million** tonnes with share of 16.2% in March 2020 followed by Container (15.0%), Other Coal (14.2%), POL Products (12.7%), Other Commodities (12.4%), Thermal Coal (7.4%), Iron ore Pellets/ Fine (7.0%), Coking coal (5.1%), LPG & LNG (4.6%), Cement (1.1%) and Fertilizer (1.1%) each, Iron & Steel (1.0%), Building materials (0.6%), Edible oil (0.5%), other ores (0.4%) and FRM Liquid, Food-grains excluding Pulses and Sugar (0.2%) each.

Cargo traffic handled during April-March, 2019-20

• During the April-March, 2019-20, Directorate of Ports, Odisha recorded highest growth in traffic at 62.0% followed by Ports of Tamil Nadu Maritime Board (25.1%), Ports Management Board, A&N Islands (23.8%), Directorate of Ports, Puducherry (21.4%) and Gujarat Maritime Board (3.4%). State Maritime/ State Directorate that recorded negative growth in traffic during April-March, 2019-20 was Captain of Ports, Goa (58.1%) followed by Kerala Maritime Board (34.3%), Directorate of Ports, Karnataka (11.7%), Maharashtra Maritime Board (7.1%) and Directorate of Ports, Andhra Pradesh (2.1%) over April-March, 2018-19 (Table-1).



 Amongst the State Maritime/ State Directorate, Gujarat Maritime Board handled the maximum Cargo of 410.44 million tonnes with a share of 68.1% followed by Directorate of Ports, Andhra Pradesh (16.8%), Maharashtra Maritime Board (6.8%), Directorate of Ports, Odisha (5.9%), Directorate of Ports, Puducherry (1.7%), A&N Islands (0.3%) and Directorate of Ports, Karnataka and Tamil Nadu Maritime Board (0.2%) each during April-March, 2019-20 (Graph 1 above).

- During the April-March, 2019-20, Sugar recorded highest growth in traffic at 58.1% followed by Other Coal (51.3%), LPG/ LNG (16.5%), Iron & Steel (16.4%), Coking Coal (7.0%), POL Products (6.4%), Container (6.0%), Other Commodities (5.6%) and Cement (0.8%). FRM Dry recorded highest negative growth 67.6% in traffic during April-March, 2019-20 followed by Other Ores (41.1%), Edible Oil (35.5%), Foodgrains excluding Pulses (29.5%), Building Material (28.8%), Thermal Coal (24.2%), Project Cargo (23.5%), FRM Liquid (12.8%), Fertilizer (9.2%), Iron Ore Pellets/ Fine (9.0%) and POL Crude (0.2%) over April-March, 2018-19 (**Table 2**).
- Amongst the all commodities, POL crude is the highest commodity handled at ports of 97.42 million tonnes with a share of 16.2% followed by Other Coal (15.1%), Container (14.9%), POL Products (11.6%), Other commodities (10.4%), Thermal Coal (8.6%), Iron Ore/ Pellets (6.6%), Coking Coal (5.4%), LPG & LNG (4.2%), Fertilizer (2.0%), Cement (1.9%), Iron & Steel (1.2%), Edible Oil (0.6%), Other Ores and Building Material (0.3%) each, FRM Liquid and Foodgrains excluding Pulses (0.2%) each during April-March, 2019-20.



Overseas and Coastal Cargo traffic handled during April-March, 2019-20

• Amongst the Non-Major Ports, Gujarat Maritime Board (GMB) handled the maximum Overseas Cargo of 363.64 million tonnes with a share of 71.1% followed by Directorate of Ports, Andhra Pradesh (16.3%), Directorate of Ports, Odisha (6.1%), MMB (4.2%), Puducherry (2.0%), TNMB (0.2%) and Directorate of Ports, Karnataka (0.1%) during April-March, 2019-20 (Graph 2).



• Amongst the Non-Major Ports, GMB handled the maximum Coastal Cargo of 46.8 million tonnes with a share of 51.5% followed by MMB (22.0%), Directorate of Ports, Andhra Pradesh (19.6%), Directorate of Ports, Odisha (4.4%), A&N Islands (2.0%), Directorate of Ports, Karnataka (0.4%), Kerala Maritime Board (KMB) and TNMB (0.1%) each during April-March, 2019-20 (Graph 3).
