CARGO HANDLED AT MAJOR PORTS DURING AND UP TO DECEMBER, 2019

Total Cargo traffic at India's Major Ports

Maritime transport activity is driven by developments in world economy, viz, growth in world output and trade. Thus, volume of seaborne cargo traffic handled by ports is mainly shaped by the levels and changes in both the global and domestic activity. Cargo traffic at India's 12 major ports during **April-December**, 2019-20, increased by 1.0% to 523.74 million tonnes from 518.45 million tonnes cargo handled during April-December, 2018-19.

The overseas cargo handled at Major Ports increased by **2.6%** from 390.40 million tonnes during April-December, 2018-19 to 400.59 Million tonnes handled during April-December, 2019-20. However, the Coastal Cargo handled at Major port decreased by **3.8%** from 128.05 million tonnes during April-December, 2018-19 to 123.15 million tonnes handled during April-December, 2019-20.


Port-wise Cargo traffic handled during December, 2019

- Cargo handled at India's major ports during December, 2019 is 60.82 million tonnes showing increase of 6.2% in the corresponding period of the previous year. The coastal cargo handled at Major Ports during December, 2019 decreased by 2.5% from 14.81 million tonnes in December, 2018 to 14.44 million tonnes during December, 2019. However, the overseas cargo handled at Major Ports increased by 9.2% to 46.37 million tonnes in December, 2019 as compared to 42.48 million tonnes during December, 2018.
- During December, 2019; Cochin Port recorded the highest growth of traffic handled i.e. 37.0% followed by Deendayal Port (34.6%), Paradip Port (13.5%), Kolkata Dock (10.8%), Mumbai Port (4.9%), Vishakhapatnam Port (3.6%) and Chidambaranar Port (2.8%). The major ports which recorded negative growth in December, 2019 are Chennai Port (14.4%), Kamarajar Port (12.2%), Mormugao Port (10.5%), New Mangalore Port (6.6%), JNPT (5.4%) and Haldia Dock Complex (1.3%).
- Amongst the 12 major ports, Paradip Port handled the maximum cargo traffic of 10.36 million tonnes with a share of 17.0% in the total cargo handled at Major Ports followed by Deendayal Port (16.8%), Vishakhapatnam Port (10.7%), JNPT (9.5%), Mumbai Port (8.7%), Haldia Dock Complex (6.9%), Chennai Port (6.1%), New Mangalore Port (5.6%), Cochin Port (4.8%), Kamarajar Port (4.7%), Chidambaranar Port (4.6%), Kolkata Dock System (2.5%) and Mormugao Port (2.2%).
- At a broad commodity level, Iron and Steel achieved highest growth of 43.6% in December, 2019 followed by Iron ore (42.7%), FRM Liquid (42.1%), POL-Products

- (37.1%), Sugar (35.9%), LPG/LNG (23.3%), FRM-Dry (22.6%), Cement (16.1%), Other Coal (14.8), Other Commodities (4.6%), Edible Oil (2.0%) and POL Crude (2.0%). Other ores recorded highest negative growth of 48.4% in December, 2019 followed Thermal Coal (13.5%), Coking Coal (5.9%), Fertilizer (5.7%) and Container (1.2%).
- At a broad commodity level, POL-crude handled the maximum cargo traffic of 12.8 Million tonnes in December, 2019 with a share of 21.1% followed by Container (20.1%), Thermal Coal (11.1%), POL Products (9.9%), Iron ore (9.0%), Other commodities (8.4%), Coking coal (6.0%), Other coal (4.2%), LPG/LNG (2.0%), Fertilizer (1.5%), Edible Oil (1.5%), Iron & Steel (1.3%), FRM-Liquid (1.1%), FRM-Dry (1.1%), Cement (0.6%), Sugar (0.4%) and Other Ores (0.3%).

Cargo traffic handled during April-December, 2019-20

- During April-December, 2019-20, Deendayal Port recorded highest growth in traffic handled at 8.8% followed by Vishakhapatnam Port (8.6%), Cochin Port (7.4%), V.O.C Port (4.6%), Paradip Port (4.0%), Haldia Dock (2.7%), Mumbai Port (1.8%) and Kolkata Dock system (1.2%). Major ports that recorded negative growth in traffic during April-December, 2019-20 were: Mormugao Port (14.5%) followed by New Mangalore Port (13.5%), Chennai Port (10.1%), Kamarajar Port (8.9%) and JNPT (3.4%) over April-December, 2018-19 (Table A).
- Amongst the Major Ports, Deendayal Port handled the maximum Cargo of 92.41 million tonnes with a share of 17.6% followed by Paradip Port (16.0%), Vishakhapatnam Port (10.2%), JNPT (9.7%), Mumbai Port (8.8%), Chennai Port (6.8%), Haldia Dock Complex (6.4%), New Mangalore Port (5.3%), Chidambaranar Port (5.1%), Cochin Port (4.8%), Kamarajar Port (4.5%), Kolkata Dock System (2.5%) and Mormugao Port (2.2%) during April-December, 2019-20 (Graph- I below).

- At a broad commodity level, **Project Cargo** recorded the **highest growth in traffic at 106.9%** followed by Sugar and Food Grain excluding pulses (52.5%) each, Iron ore (31.1%), LPG/LNG (22.9%), Fertilizer (19.3%), POL-Product (10.1%), FRM-Liquid (7.7%), other coal (4.4%), Coking Coal (3.4%), Iron & Steel (2.9%), Container (2.0%), FRM-Dry (1.3%), Other commodities and Cement (0.4%) each, and edible Oil (0.2%). Pulses recorded the highest negative growth of 49.7% followed by Thermal Coal (18.9%), Other Ores (8.7%) and POL-Crude (3.1%) over April-December, 2018-19 (**Table B**).
- Amongst all the commodities, POL-Crude handled the maximum cargo of 112.85 million tonnes with a share of 21.5% followed by Container (21.0%), Thermal coal (11.3%), POL Products (9.8%), Others commodities (9.3%), Iron ore (7.6%), Coking coal (5.8%), Other coal (3.6%), LPG/LNG (1.9%), Edible oil (1.7%), Fertilizer (1.5%), Iron & Steel (1.4%), FRM Dry and FRM liquid (0.9%) each, Other ores (0.6%), Cement (0.5%) and Sugar (0.4%) during April-December, 2019-20.



Overseas and Coastal Cargo traffic handled during April-December, 2019-20

Amongst the Major Ports, Deendayal Port handled the maximum Overseas Cargo of 80.38 million tonnes with a share of 20.1% followed by Paradip Port (14.4%), JNPT (11.9%), Vishakhapatnam Port (10.3%), Chennai Port (8.1%), Mumbai Port (6.6%), Haldia Dock (5.5%), New Mangalore Port (5.2%), Chidambaranar Port (5.1%), Cochin Port (4.2%), Kamarajar Port (3.4%), Kolkata Dock (2.7%) and Mormugao Port (2.6%) during April-December, 2019-20 (Graph II).



Amongst the Major Ports, Paradip Port handled the maximum Coastal Cargo of 26.12 million tonnes with a share of 21.2% followed by Mumbai Port (16.1%), Vishakhapatnam Port (10.0%), Deendayal Port (9.8%), Haldia Dock (9.6%), Kamarajar Port (7.8%), Cochin Port (6.6%), New Mangalore Port (5.5%), Chidambaranar Port (5.3%), Chennai Port (2.9%), JNPT (2.5%), Kolkata Dock (1.7%) and Mormugao Port (0.9%) during April-December, 2019-20 (Graph III).
