#### CARGO TRAFFIC HANDLED AT MAJOR PORTS DURING AND UP TO MAY, 2021

### **Total Cargo traffic at India's Major Ports**

Maritime transport activity is driven by developments in world economy, viz, growth in world output and trade. Thus, volume of seaborne cargo traffic handled by ports is mainly shaped by the levels and changes in both the global and domestic activity. Cargo traffic at India's 12 major ports during **April-May**, 2021-22, increased by 30.7% to 121.97 million tonnes from 93.33 million tonnes cargo handled during April-May, 2020-21.

The Overseas cargo handled at Major Ports increased by **30.3%** from 73.12 million tonnes during April-May, 2020-21 to 95.26 Million tonnes handled during April-May, 2021-22. The Coastal Cargo handled at Major port also increased by **32.2%** from 20.21 million tonnes during April-May, 2020-21 to 26.71 million tonnes handled during April-May, 2021-22.

## Port-wise Cargo traffic handled during May, 2021

Cargo handled at India's major ports during May, 2021 is 59.76 million tonnes showing an increase of 31.3% as compared to the corresponding period of the previous year. The coastal cargo handled at Major Ports during May, 2021 increased by 22.3% from 10.49 million tonnes in May, 2020 to 12.83 million tonnes during May, 2021. The overseas cargo handled at Major Ports also increased by 33.9% to 46.92 million tonnes in May, 2021 as compared to 35.04 million tonnes during May, 2020.

- During May, 2021; Kamarajar Port recorded the highest growth of traffic handled i.e. 174.1% followed Chennai Port (77.8%), Cochin Port (67.9%), JNPT (51.9%), Deendayal Port (34.9%), SMP Kolkata Dock System (32.5%), Mumbai Port (31.3%), Vizag Port (26.8%), Paradip Port (23.5%), SMP Haldia Dock Complex (10.9%), and VOC Port (4.1%). The major ports which recorded negative growth in May, 2021 are Mormugao Port (12.1%) and NMPT (3.5%).
- Amongst the 12 major ports, Deendayal Port handled the maximum cargo traffic of 11.66 million tonnes with a share of 19.5% in the total cargo handled at Major Ports followed by Paradip Port (15.6%), Vizag Port (10.5%), JNPT (10.4%), Mumbai Port (7.6%), Chennai Port (6.3%), NMPT (5.8%), SMP Haldia Dock Complex (5.3%), Kamarajar Port (5.3%), Cochin Port (4.3%), VOC Port (4.2%), Mormugao Port (3.6%) and SMP Kolkata Dock System (1.7%).
- At a broad commodity level, Foodgrains excluding Pulses achieved highest growth of 676.8% in May, 2021 followed by Thermal Coal (216.1%), FRM-Dry (59.3%), Containers (59.2%), Other Commodities (53.7%), Edible Oil (48.7%), Coking Coal (29.0%), Project Cargo (18.3%), Cement (13.4%), LPG or LNG (13.1%), POL-Crude (12.1%) Other Ores (8.2%), Iron-ore/Pellets (5.7%) and POL-Products (1.2%). Pulses recorded highest negative growth of 100% in May, 2021 followed by Other Coal (42.0%), Sugar (40.4%), Iron and Steel (30.4%), Fertilizer (26.8%) and FRM Liquid (17.6%).
- At a broad commodity level, Containers handled the maximum cargo traffic of 13.53 Million tonnes in May, 2021 with a share of 22.6% followed by POL-Crude (19.0%), Thermal Coal (14.8%), Iron ore (10.3%), Other commodities(8.1%), POL-Products (7.9%), Coking coal (4.9%), Other coal

(2.4%), LPG/LNG (2.2%), Edible Oil (1.4%), Iron & Steel (1.3%), FRM Dry (1.0%), Fertilizer (1.0%), Other Ores (0.8%), Foodgrains excluding Pulses (0.6%), FRM-Liquid (0.6%) Sugar (0.5%), Cement (0.4%) and Project Cargo (0.1%).

## Cargo traffic handled during April-May, 2021-22

- During April-May, 2021-22, Kamarajar Port recorded highest growth of 96.3% in traffic handled at Major Ports followed by Chennai Port (68.4%), JNPT (55.8%), Cochin Port (51.6%), SMP Kolkata Dock System (29.7%), Deendayal Port (28.8%), Paradip Port (27.4%), SMP Haldia Dock Complex (22.8%), VOC Port (22.5%), Mumbai Port (22.1%), Vizag Port (18.9%) and Mormugao Port (12.9%). The only Major port that recorded negative growth in traffic during April-May, 2021-22 was NMPT (3.7%) over April-May, 2020-21 (Table A).
- Amongst the Major Ports, Deendayal Port handled the maximum Cargo of 22.80 million tonnes with a share of 18.7% followed by Paradip Port (16.8%), JNPT (10.3%), Vizag Port (9.7%), Mumbai Port (7.6%), Chennai Port (6.3%), SMP Haldia Dock Complex (5.7%), NMPT (5.4%), Kamarajar Port (5.2%), VOC Port (4.7%), Cochin Port (4.2%), Mormugao Port (3.7%), and SPM Kolkata Dock System (1.8%) during April-May, 2021-22 (Graph-I below).



At a broad commodity level, Foodgrain excluding Pulses recorded the highest growth in traffic during April-May, 2021-22 at 718.0% followed by Project cargo (107.6%), Thermal Coal (66.4%), Container (64.5%) Cement (54.6%), Other Commodities (54.4%), FRM-Dry (51.5%), Edible Oil (39.9%), Iron Ore pellets/fine (37.1%), Coking Coal (20.6%), Other Ores (12.0%), POL-Crude (11.6%), LPG/LNG (9.0%) and FRM-Liquid (7.0%). Other Coal recorded the highest negative

- growth of 30.0% followed by Sugar (26.8%), Fertilizer (19.5%) Iron & Steel (10.7%) and POL-Products (0.2%), over April-May, 2020-21 (Table B).
- Amongst all the commodities, Container handled the maximum cargo of 27.63 million tonnes with a share of 22.7% followed by POL-Crude (18.8%), Thermal coal (14.6%), Iron ore/Pellets (10.4%), Others commodities (8.4%), POL Products (7.7%), Coking coal (5.4%), Other coal (2.3%), LPG/LNG (2.0%), Edible oil (1.4%), Iron & Steel (1.3%), FRM Dry (1.1%), Other Ores (0.8%), Fertilizer (0.8%), FRM liquid (0.6%), Sugar (0.6%), Cement (0.5%), Foodgrains excluding Pulses (0.5%) and Project Cargo (0.1%) during April-May, 2021-22.



# Overseas and Coastal Cargo traffic handled during April-May, 2021-22

• Amongst the Major Ports, Deendayal Port handled the maximum Overseas Cargo of 20.44 million tonnes with a share of 21.5% followed by Paradip Port (15.3%), JNPT (12.5%), Vizag Port (8.8%),

Chennai Port (7.1%), SMP Haldia Dock (6.4%), Mumbai Port (5.4%), NMPT (5.0%), Mormugao Port (4.3%), VOC Port (4.1%), Kamarajar Port (4.0%), Cochin Port (3.4%) and SMP Kolkata Dock (2.2%) during April-May, 2021-22 (Graph II).



• Amongst the Major Ports, Paradip Port handled the maximum Coastal Cargo of 5.94 million tonnes with a share of 22.2% followed by Mumbai Port (15.1%), Vizag Port (13.0%), Kamarajar Port (9.5%), Deendayal Port (8.8%), Cochin Port (7.3%), VOC Port (7.0%), NMPT (6.7%), Chennai Port (3.6%), SMP Haldia Dock (2.9%), JNPT (2.3%), Mormugao Port (1.4%) and SMP Kolkata Dock (0.2%) during April-May, 2021-22 (Graph III).
