Maritime transport activity is driven by developments in world economy, viz, growth in world output and trade. Thus, volume of seaborne cargo traffic handled by ports is mainly shaped by the levels and changes in both the global and domestic activity. Cargo traffic at Non-Major Ports during **April-August, 2020-21, decreased by 17.2% to 209.36 million tonnes** from 252.82 million tonnes handled during April-August, 2019-20.

The overseas cargo traffic handled at Non-Major Ports during April-August, 2020-21 decreased by 14.8% to 182.92 million tonnes from 214.63 million tonnes during April-August, 2019-20. The coastal cargo traffic handled at Non-Major Ports during April-August, 2020-21 decreased by 30.8% to 26.44 million tonnes from 38.18 million tonnes handled during April-August, 2019-20.

Port-wise Cargo traffic handled during August, 2020


- Cargo handled at Non-Major Ports during August, 2020 is 45.19 million tonnes showing a decrease in growth of 8.2% in the corresponding period of the previous year. The coastal cargo traffic handled at Non-Major Ports during August, 2020 decreased by 24.5% to 5.26 million tonnes from 6.97 million tonnes during August, 2019. The overseas cargo handled at Non-Major Ports during August, 2020 decreased by 5.5% to 39.93 million tonnes from 42.27 million tonnes during August, 2019.
- During August, 2020, the Non-Major Ports of Kerala Maritime Board recorded highest growth in traffic of 37.4%, followed by the Non-Major Ports of Directorate of Ports, Karnataka (27.5%), Directorate of Ports, Odisha (20.8%) and Directorate of Ports, Puducherry (1.6%). The State Maritime/ State Directorate which recorded negative growth in August, 2020 are Maharashtra Maritime Board (24.3%), Andhra Pradesh Maritime Board (17.1%), Tamil Nadu Maritime Board (12.1%), Gujarat Maritime Board (GMB) (7.7%) and Ports Management Board, A&N (3.1%).
- Amongst the State Maritime/ State Directorate, Gujarat Maritime Board handled the maximum cargo traffic at 30.67 million tonnes with a share of (67.9%) in the total cargo handled at State Maritime/State Directorate followed by Andhra Pradesh Maritime Board (14.5%), Directorate of Ports, Odisha (8.8%), Maharashtra Maritime Board (5.0%), Directorate of Ports, Puducherry (1.8%), Tamil Nadu Maritime Board (1.7%), Ports Management Board, A&N Islands (0.3%) and Directorate of Ports, Puducherry (0.1%).
- At a broad commodity level, Foodgrain excluding Pulses achieved highest growth of 191.0% in August, 2020 followed by Fertilizer (103.7%), Other Ores (45.6%), Other Commodities (19.5%),

and Iron Ore (6.2%). Project Cargo recorded highest negative growth of 83.0% in August, 2020 followed by Pulses (54.6%), Building Material (43.0%), Other Coal (35.3%), Iron & Steel (27.9%), Thermal Coal (27.0%), Cement (26.3%), POL Crude (19.2%), FRM Liquid (13.9%), Edible Oil (12.8%), Coking Coal (6.4%), POL Products (2.6%), Container (2.2%) and LPG or LNG (1.3%).

At a broad commodity level, Container handled the maximum cargo traffic of 8.16 Million tonnes with share of 18.1% in August 2020 followed by POL Crude (14.3%), POL Products (12.4%), Other Commodities (11.8%), Other Coal (10.1%), Iron ore Pellets/ Fine (8.5%), Coking coal (6.3%), Thermal Coal (6.0%), LPG or LNG (4.7%), Fertilizer (3.2%), Cement and Iron & Steel (1.2%) each, Edible oil (0.7%), Food-grains excluding Pulses (0.5%), Other Ores and Sugar (0.3%) each, FRM Liquid (0.2%) and Pulses and Building Material (0.1%) each.

Cargo traffic handled during April-August, 2020-21

During the April-August, 2020-21, Directorate of Ports, Odisha recorded highest growth in traffic at 24.5% followed by Captain of Ports, Goa (3.5%). State Maritime/ State Directorate that recorded negative growth in traffic during April-August, 2020-21 was Kerala Maritime Board (57.9%) followed by Directorate of Ports, Karnataka (40.2%), Ports Management Board, A&N Islands (34.7%), Maharashtra Maritime Board (32.7%), Tamil Nadu Maritime Board (28.8%), Directorate of Ports, Puducherry (27.2%), Andhra Pradesh Maritime Board (21.2%) and Gujarat Maritime Board (17.1%) over April-August, 2019-20 (Table-1).



Amongst the State Maritime/ State Directorate, Gujarat Maritime Board handled the maximum Cargo of 140.09 million tonnes with a share of 66.9% followed by Andhra Pradesh Maritime Board (16.4%), Directorate of Ports, Odisha (7.7%), Maharashtra Maritime Board (5.5%), Directorate of Ports, Puducherry (1.6%), Tamil Nadu Maritime Board (1.5%), A&N Islands (0.2%) and Directorate of Ports, Karnataka (0.1%) during April-August, 2020-21 (Graph 1 above).

During the April-August, 2020-21, Foodgrains excluding Pulses Record highest growth of 85.7% followed by Sugar (58.8%), Fertilizer (12.9%), Edible Oil (9.8%), FRM Liquid (5.3%) and Other Commodities (1.2%). Project Cargo recorded highest negative growth 67.8% in traffic during

April-August, 2020-21 followed by Building Material (50.6%), Cement (44.4%), Other Coal (40.3%), Thermal Coal (38.1%), Pulses (37.4%), POL Crude (21.5%), Coking Coal (18.1%), Container (14.8%), Other Ores (14.0%), Iron Ore Pellets/ Fine (3.7%), LPG/ LNG (3.1%), Iron and Steel (3.0%) and POL Products (0.9%) over April-August, 2019-20 (**Table 2**).

Amongst all commodities, Container is the highest commodity handled at ports of 35.12 million tonnes with a share of 16.8% followed by POL Crude (15.1%), POL Products (13.3%), Other commodities (11.7%), Other Coal (11.3%), Iron Ore/ Pellets (7.7%), Thermal Coal (6.3%), Coking Coal (5.3%), LPG & LNG (4.7%), Fertilizer (2.6%), Iron & Steel (1.5%), Cement (1.3%), Edible Oil (0.7%), Foodgrains excluding Pulses (0.5%), Sugar (0.4%), Other Ores and FRM Liquid (0.3%) each and Pulses and Building Material (0.1%) each during April-August, 2020-21.



Overseas and Coastal Cargo traffic handled during April-August, 2020-21

 Amongst the Non-Major Ports, Gujarat Maritime Board (GMB) handled the maximum Overseas Cargo of 126.79 million tonnes with a share of 69.3% followed by Andhra Pradesh Maritime Board (16.1%), Directorate of Ports, Odisha (8.1%), MMB (2.9%), Puducherry (1.8%), TNMB (1.6%) and Directorate of Ports, Karnataka (0.1%) during April-August, 2020-21 (Graph 2).



 Amongst the Non-Major Ports, GMB handled the maximum Coastal Cargo of 13.29 million tonnes with a share of 50.3% followed by MMB (23.1%), Andhra Pradesh Maritime Board (18.8%), Directorate of Ports, Odisha (5.2%), A&N Islands (1.7%), TNMB (0.5%), Directorate of Ports, Karnataka (0.3%), and Kerala Maritime Board (KMB) (0.1%) each during April-August, 2020-21
