CARGO HANDLED AT STATE MARITIME/ STATE DIRECTORATE (Non-Major Ports) DURING APRIL, 2020

Total Cargo traffic at India's State Maritime/ State Directorate

Maritime transport activity is driven by developments in world economy, viz, growth in world output and trade. Thus, volume of seaborne cargo traffic handled by ports is mainly shaped by the levels and changes in both the global and domestic activity. Cargo traffic at Non-Major Ports during **April 2020**, **decreased by 24% to 38.55 million tonnes** from 50.7 million tonnes handled during April 2019.

The overseas cargo handled at Non-Major Ports during April, 2020 decreased by 18.8% to 34.24 million tonnes from 42.18 million tonnes during April, 2019. However, the coastal cargo handled at Non-Major Ports during April, 2020 decreased by 49.5% to 4.30 million tonnes from 8.53 million tonnes handled during April, 2019.

Port-wise Cargo traffic handled during April, 2020

- During April, 2020, the Non-Major Ports of Tamil Nadu Maritime Board posted highest growth in traffic of 23.0% followed by the Non-Major Ports of Directorate of Ports, Odisha (15.6%). The State Maritime/ State Directorate which recorded negative growth in April, 2020 are Directorate of Ports, Karnataka (80.1%) followed by Kerala Maritime Board (79.1%), Directorate of Ports, A&N Islands (58.1%), Maharashtra Maritime Board (MMB) (51.7%), Directorate of Ports, Pudducherry (38.2%) and Gujarat Maritime Board (GMB) (27.7%).
- Amongst the State Maritime/ State Directorate, Gujarat Maritime Board handled the maximum cargo traffic at 24.79 million tonnes with a share of (64.3%) in the total cargo handled at State Maritime/State Directorate followed by Directorate of Ports Andhra Pradesh (21.9%), Odisha (6.1%), Maharashtra Maritime Board (5.6%), Puducherry (1.7%), A&N Islands (0.2%), TNMB and Karnataka (0.1%) each.
- At a broad commodity level, **POL Products achieved highest growth of 10.3%** in April, 2020 followed by Sugar (4.0%). Building Material recorded highest negative growth of 86.2% in April, 2020 followed by Cement (84.9%), Other Ore (69.0%), Project Cargo (57.2%), Iron Ore (46.5%), Iron and Steel (45.4%), Thermal Coal (36.7%), Container (33.6%), LPG/LNG (28.3%), Edible Oil (27.8%), Fertilizer (23.4%), Other Coal (20.4%), Other Commodities (17.1%), POL Crude (16.8%), Coking Coal (16.1%) and Foodgrains excluding Pulses (7.1%).
- At a broad commodity level, POL crude handled the maximum cargo traffic of 6.65 Million tonnes with share of 17.2% in April, 2020 followed by Other Coal (17.2%), POL Products

(14.6%), Container (12.9%), other commodities (11.2%), thermal coal (8.3%), Coking coal (5.7%), Iron ore Pellets/ Fine (4.7%), LPG & LNG (3.7%), Fertilizer (1.6%), Iron & Steel (0.9%), Edible oil (0.5%), Cement (0.4%) and FRM Liquid, Food grains excluding pulses & Sugar (0.3%) each.





Overseas and Coastal Cargo traffic handled during April, 2020

• Amongst the Non-Major Ports, Gujarat Maritime Board (GMB) handled the maximum Overseas Cargo of 23.0 million tonnes with a share of 67.2% followed by Directorate of Ports, Andhra Pradesh (20.3%), Directorate of Ports, Odisha (6.5%), MMB (3.9%), Puducherry (1.9%), TNMB (0.2%) and Directorate of Ports, Karnataka (0.1%) during April, 2020 (Graph 2).



• Amongst the Non-Major Ports, GMB handled the maximum Coastal Cargo of 1.80 million tonnes with a share of 41.7% followed by Directorate of Ports, Andhra Pradesh (34.6%), MMB (18.9%), Directorate of Ports, Odisha (2.9%), A&N Islands (1.5%), Directorate of Ports, Karnataka (0.2%) and Directorate of Ports, Kerala (0.1%) during April, 2020 (Graph 3).
